Number bonds to 10 and 20.

Ask your child if they can remember what a number bond is? (Two numbers that add together to make another number.)

Can they think of any number bonds for 10? – What two numbers add together to make 10.

Ask your child to make a big plus sign (+) using paper and colours!

1S – should remember the number bond song! Sung to the tune of Frere Jacques.

1+9, 1+9, 9+1, 9+1, put them both together, put them both together, that makes 10, that makes 10!

2+8, 2+8, 8+2, 8+2, put them both together, put them both together, that makes 10, that makes 10!

3+7, 3+7, 7+3, 7+3, put them both together, put them both together, that makes 10, that makes 10!

4+6, 4+6, 6+4, 6+4, put them both together, put them both together, that makes 10, that makes 10!

5+5, 5+5, 5+5, 5+5, put them both together, put them both together, that makes 10, that makes 10!

Have a go at answering the questions.

Can you find 10 objects around the house you can use for counting – you could use pennies, buttons or even some small toys such as Lego bricks. How many different ways can you make 10? Can you write these numbers sentences on paper using the + sign? Can you write them big outside using chalk?

Try now to work out some number bonds to 20. Find 20 small objects to help you. How many ways can you split them into 2 groups to make 20? Have a go at writing the number sentence.

Talk to your grown up about what you notice about the number bonds to 10 and the number bonds to 20.
