- 1) What is the bees home called?
- 2) Why do bee keepers wear protective clothing?
- 3) What does the bee keeper use to make the bees feel calm and sleepy when he collects the honey?
- 4) How do the bees store the honey in their bee hive?
- 5) How do the bees keep the honey fresh?
- 6) What do Worker Bees do?
- 7) What does the Queen Bee do?

Maybe today you can go for a walk with your grown up and see if you can spot any bees collecting nectar. What sort of flowers are the bees collecting from?

You can keep an eye out for other mini beasts as well!

Do you have a jar of honey in the kitchen? Maybe you and your family can have honey on toast for breakfast. Have a look at the label on the jar, does it tell you where the honey was made?
