Think about the size of your ladybird, how many wings does it have? How many spots will you give your ladybird? Did you know you can tell how old a ladybird is by the number of spots it has?

You are going to use your picture of a ladybird to create your very own story.

So first things first, -your ladybird needs a name! Mine's called Trevor; he has black wings with seven spots on each side.

Can you work out how many spots he has altogether?

Have a think about what adjectives you would use to describe your ladybird.

What about your ladybird's personality? Is it kind, caring and generous like Mrs Shirley's ladybird or is it a bit more mischievous, cheeky and impulsive?

Can you write a description of your ladybird and tell me all about it? Where does your ladybird live?

What does it eat? Where does it like to fly? Does it have a favourite flower?

Don't forget to use your capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. Have you used exciting wow words? Can you challenge yourself and use the rule of three?
