Creative

Since Saturday the rules on social distancing have changed and playgrounds and parks have reopened! Can you design and build using any materials of your choice a playground or park? What will you include in your park; slides, swings, climbing frames or zip lines? Will your park have a swimming pool? Can you buy ice creams or refreshments?

In school we will plan our play grounds on paper and then build them as best as we can in the bark area.

Sophie and her Mummy had a tea with a tiger. The tiger ate all the food and drank all the drink. Can you make some more food for Sophie and her Mummy using play doh?

Maths

Water play! Gather together as many different sized pots, pans, jugs, cups, spoons as you can and explore playing in the water. How many cups of water does it take to fill a saucepan? Which will hold more water, a pot or a spoon? How many spoons of water does it take to fill the cup? Can you fill the jug half full? What does empty mean?

Floating and sinking. Gather together different objects including some that will float (sponge, some plastic toys) and some that will sink (rock, heavy toy). Place an object in the water, what happens? Use the language float, sink, light, heavy, deep, shallow.

English

In the story Sophie and her Mummy go to the shops to buy more food and drink. Can you help Sophie and her Mummy buy writing a shopping list for them?

Everyday activities

Reading; find a book that you love or a new one, either you read to your grown up or listen to them telling the story. Writing; practise writing all the letters and numbers to 20, or higher!

Maths; count objects around your home, look for repeating patterns and sort your toys by shape/colour/size.
